Post-Overdose/Active Withdrawal Emergency Room Discharge.

For emergency room visits for addiction, if a discharge order is imminent prior to linking patient with treatment/recovery resources:

- Ask for a patient advocate (NYS Patients' Bill of Rights)

- 2. Ask to appeal the decision to discharge (NYS Patients' Bill of Rights) LOCATED HERE *
- Call the State Attorney General's Health Care Bureau Helpline at 1-800-428-9071. Letter from Attorney General to those seeking assistance: LOCATED HERE *
- Show physician or staff the letter from OASAS and DOH (Robert Kent & Daniel Sheppard Letter to Hospital CEO) <u>LOCATED HERE</u> *
- Show physicians the exception that allows a physician to administer a single dose of buprenorphine in an emergency for 3 days LOCATED HERE *

Be polite but firm. If still discharged, be persistent in seeking treatment, and contact OASAS and FOR-NY.
